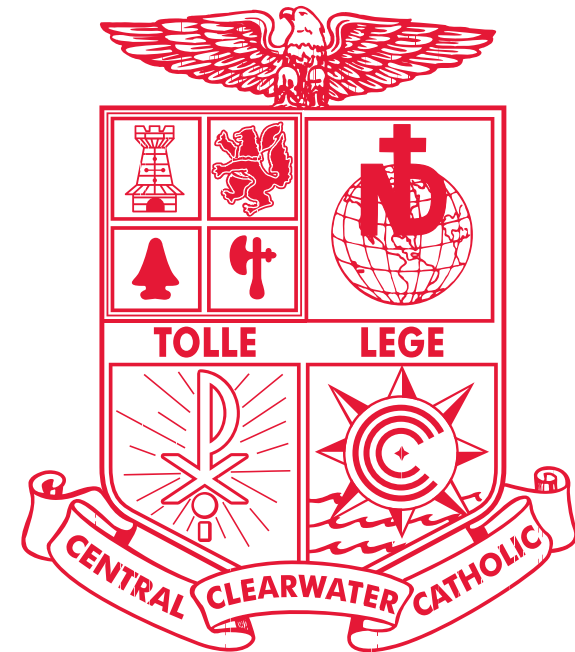

ROBERT E. DOLAN JR.

Bob Dolan, a class of 1976 alumnus, earned three varsity letters as a member of the Clearwater Central Catholic High School boys basketball team. In addition to excelling as an athlete, he was vice president of his senior class and a member of the National Honor Society.

Bob scored over 1,000 points in his basketball career at CCC. In his senior year he was selected All-Catholic All American, Prep Magazine All-American, All-City, All-County, All-State and CCC's Most Valuable Player while leading the Marauders to the Florida State High School Athletic Association Basketball State Championship. The championship game in 1976 still stands as one of the all-time greatest games in CCC history with CCC defeating the Blountstown Tigers 59-58. At the end of the game, CCC was down 57-58 when Bob was fouled with no time remaining on the clock. His two free throws gave CCC the State Championship title. He was named MVP of the State Tournament and to the All-Tournament Team.

After graduation Bob received a four-year scholarship to Florida Southern College where he played on their 1979 Final Four basketball team.

Bob is currently an account manager for IC Corporation, School Bus Division and lives in Davie, Florida.

MEHRYN E. (CORRIGAN) IMPERIALE

Mehryn (Corrigan) Imperiale, a class of 1998 alumnus, earned four varsity letters at Clearwater Central Catholic High School as a member of the girls' soccer team from 1994 to 1998 and was a Florida Olympic Development team member from 1996 to 1998.

Mehryn excelled as a mid-fielder leading the Marauders to the Florida High School State Championships in 1997. She was selected team captain and Most Valuable Player for the Marauders in 1998. In addition, she was a National Soccer Coaches Association of America All-south team selection, All-Pinellas County first team, All-State first team, first team All-South and FHSAA 3A Player of the Year recipient.

After graduating from CCC, Mehryn accepted a scholarship to play for the University of Miami where she was an Academic All Big East selection. She graduated in 2002 with a degree in Marketing

Mehryn is currently working as a Senior Manager of Operations at Sharp Electronics and was Top Sales Manager in 2012 and 2013. She lives in Dunedin, Florida.

LAURA L. (MATEKA) McCANN

Laura (Mateka) McCann, a class of 1996 alumnus, earned four varsity letters at Clearwater Central Catholic High School as a member of the girls swimming team from 1992-1996.

Laura excelled in the 50-meter freestyle, 100-meter butterfly, 200-meter individual medley, 200-meter medley relay and the 400-meter freestyle relay. Her teams won two FHSAA district championships and qualified for the State meet each of her four years at CCC — 1992, 1993, 1994 and 1995. Laura qualified all four years for the state championship as an individual in the 100-meter butterfly and the 200-meter individual medley. She was named Most Valuable Swimmer all four years at CCC and was team captain her junior and senior years. She is still the current CCC record holder for the 200-meter medley relay, 100-meter butterfly, 50-meter freestyle and the 400-meter freestyle relay.

After graduating from CCC, Laura accepted a scholarship to swim for Florida State University. While at FSU the Lady Seminoles were ACC champions and she participated in the ACC championships swimming the 100-meter butterfly. Following graduation from FSU, Laura returned to CCC as assistant swim coach for two years followed by eight years as head coach of the Marauder swim team.

Laura is now a stay-at-home mom with three children living in Palm Harbor.

THOMAS S. SPELLISSY

Tom Spellissy, a class of 1975 alumnus, earned varsity letters as a member of the Clearwater Central Catholic High School boys basketball team from 1973-1975 and was the leading scorer for the Marauders in both the 1973-1974 and 1974-1975 seasons.

During Tom's career he was named All-State first team, CCC's Most Valuable Player, All Sun County first team and All Upper Pinellas County first team. The leading scorer in Pinellas County in 1973-1974 and second leading scorer in 1974-1975, he still holds the CCC school scoring record for two seasons with 1,231 points (just 50 points short of the most points in a career) and the Cavallaro Gymnasium single game record with 49 points on February 2, 1974.

After graduation, Tom attended the United States Military Academy, West Point and played basketball for the Black Knights. His coach at West Point was Hall of Fame and current Duke Coach Mike Krzyzewski.

After graduating from West Point in 1979, Tom continued his military career and retired as a Colonel in August of 2004. His last position was Chief of Special Programs at Special Operations Command, MacDill Air Force Base. An Army combat veteran, he was recognized as an honorary member of the U.S. Army 75th Ranger Regiment for Operation Enduring Freedom and Operation Iraqi Freedom.

Tom is currently Senior Vice President of Interim HealthCare here in Clearwater, Florida.

RYAN C. WEBB

Ryan Webb, a graduate of the CCC class of 2004, earned four varsity letters as a member of the Clearwater Central Catholic High School baseball team. In his career at CCC, Ryan had a career pitching record of 24-3. He pitched 191 innings with 270 strikeouts and 27 walks; gave up only 31 earned runs; and an ERA of 1.14. Ryan still holds the school records for most strikeouts and best ERA. While at CCC, he was also named to the All-State first team and was Pinellas County Baseball Player of the Year, Suncoast Player of the Year and Suncoast Pitcher of the Year.

In 2002, Ryan's sophomore year, CCC won the Florida High School Athletic Association State Baseball Championship beating Florida Christian 5-0 and was State Runner-up the following year losing to Pensacola Catholic 1-0 in nine innings. Over those two years (2002-2003) CCC's record was 52-6.

Highly recruited his senior year, Ryan accepted a baseball scholarship to Wake Forest University. In the 2004 Major League Baseball draft, Ryan was selected by the Oakland Athletics in the 4th round. He signed with the A's that summer and played five years in the A's organization. He then played for the San Diego Padres from 2009-2010, Miami Marlins 2011-2013, Baltimore Orioles 2014-2015, Cleveland Indians in 2015 and the Tampa Bay Rays and Chicago White Sox in 2016.

RYAN WEBER

Ryan Weber, a graduate of the CCC class of 2008, earned four varsity letters as a member of the Clearwater Central Catholic High School baseball team. Ryan pitched four years for CCC and had a career record of 26-1. He still holds the school record for most wins in a season—11-0 in 2007. During this undefeated season, his ERA was 0.58; he struck out 100 batters in 72 innings; and surrendered just eight walks. That year, CCC won the Florida High School Athletic Association State Baseball Championship. Ryan pitched a 3-0 shutout against #1 ranked Jacksonville Bolles in the state semi-final game that advanced the Marauders to the championship game which they won 9-2 against Trinity Prep.

In his career at CCC, Ryan pitched 191 innings, with 210 strikeouts, 23 walks, gave up only 26 earned runs and had an ERA of 1.21. In addition, he was named to the All-State first team, Pinellas County Baseball Player of the Year, Suncoast Player of the Year and Suncoast Pitcher of the Year.

Ryan was selected to the USA Junior National Baseball team three times. In 2006 he became the first pitcher to pitch a no-hitter in Youth National Team history when he defeated host Venezuela. Seven days later he defeated Venezuela again in the championship game with a complete game effort as the U.S. won, 13-3. He finished the tourney with a 1.93 ERA and 19 strikeouts in 14 innings earning him tournament MVP and Best Pitcher honors.

In the 2008 Major League Baseball draft, Ryan was selected by the Philadelphia Phillies in the 11th round. Ryan opted to play a year for St. Petersburg College and in the 2009 draft was selected by the Atlanta Braves. He played seven years in professional baseball with the Braves organization and is currently on the 25-man roster of the Seattle Mariners for the 2017 season.
