Lacy Dodd Miske is a member of Clearwater Central Catholic's class of 1995. Following her days at CCC, Lacy continued her education at the University of Notre Dame and graduated in 1999, with a Bachelor of Arts degree in American Studies. The next chapter of Lacy's life led her to the Captain's Career Course with the United States Army Logistics Management College in Ft. Lee, Virginia.

Serving as a Captain in the United States Army from 2000 to 2005, Lacy was awarded three Army Commendation Medals, a National Defense Service Medal, an Army Achievement Medal, and an Army Service Ribbon. Lacy is a combat veteran of Operation Iraqi Freedom.

From 2007 to 2012, Lacy served on the board of directors at Room at the Inn (now MiraVia). There she assisted with a capital campaign to establish the nation's first college-based maternity home for pregnant students, helping them choose life and complete their educations. In November 2010, Lacy Miske was nominated as one of "12 Catholic Heroes for America and the World".

For over 10 years, Lacy has worked as Vice President, Senior Operations Consultant, at Bank of America. Lacy serves as a member of Bank of America's military support affinity group and has received Bank of America's Gold, Silver, and Platinum awards.

Lacy, mother to current CCC senior Mary-Logan '18, is an involved alumna and parent who volunteers her time at CCC as The Central Stage playbill chair person, assisting in the publication of the playbills and ad fundraising. She recently chaperoned the Respect Life Ministry trip to our nation's capital for the 2018 March for Life. Outside of the CCC community, Lacy supports the Kimberly Home Pregnancy Resource Center and the American Legion Auxiliary Dunedin Post 275.

Lacy believes it is important to stay connected to CCC because, "I have witnessed first-hand how involvement by alumni and parents can truly make a difference with contributions of time, talent or treasure, no matter how big or small.
